

Introduction

Like a drop of water impacting a still pond, the Gospel of Jesus Christ has changed your life and will progressively affect the lives of those around you and the world...

As one who is called of God to be salt and light to a dying world, you are among the best qualified to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with the lost, and to help train others in presenting the gospel. You are surrounded by men and women of faith in your church; who have experienced the saving grace of God and have put their trust and hope in Christ. You are men and woman of The Word...

Chances are, you also have years of experience in sharing your faith and biblical truths; which means you have your senses exercised to discern both good and evil and can rightly divide the Word of Truth. Above all else, you have the Lord Jesus Christ himself and the Holy Spirit interceding for you and living in you, as you witness and share the gospel of Christ with others.

More than a how-to manual, this course will focus on essential the Biblical truths and help transform you and your fellow believers into a more effective witness for Christ...the Biblical Way. One of the great truths you will discover is that it is better to learn how to be led of the Lord in all that you say and do, rather than just memorizing a technique or canned presentation of the Gospel. This material is presented in a way to help you and those you train, to gain a surer foundation in the Gospel of Christ, His Holy Spirit and God's call and commission on your life.

These scripture-based lessons and discussions will help you and your participants become a stronger, more mature, and better equipped disciple. This course focuses on the seven major areas where the Gospel impacts us the most in our lives: our family and friends, our workplaces, our communities, our city, our nation and our world.

As the facilitator of this training course, you have the privilege of encouraging and mentoring believers in effectively sharing the gospel with others. You will help others develop an eternal perspective on life and everyday situations.

Those who participate in this course, will grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and recognize the everyday opportunities we have in sharing the gospel. They will be more compassionate to go beyond, their fears and apprehensions, to make a real difference in the lives of others. These disciples will become Sowers of the Word and in turn will be better equipped to train others also.

All Christians have an inward desire for others to be saved. The indwelling Holy Spirit encourages and prompts us to share our faith with others... But most people do not know how to get started. Where they can get scripture from... And who is there to help them get started?

God is working in their hearts and minds and they just need a little help from you, to show them the way, and how to get started. That's where this course and your experience, and desire to help others comes in.

As you know, the goal of witnessing is to help win boys and girls, men and women come to a saving faith in Jesus Christ through encouraging, continual discipleship and growth. Sharing the gospel is not a spiritual activity we simply check off our Christian to-do list. The very act of sharing the gospel focuses on the needs of others.

Presenting the Living Word of God, supported by our own personal testimony of what God has done for us, is a powerful witness indeed for Christ, and will change lives!

Unbelievers can sense right away if a Christian is sharing the gospel with them, just to hear themselves talk... Sharing the Gospel should never be a one-sided conversation. It is never all about us and our duty to witness. It's about helping the other person come to faith in Christ. *It's about caring enough to listen and respond accordingly, in love and in wisdom.*

Now, sharing the Gospel and starting a person down the path of discipleship, cannot happen apart from the Word of God. As a Christian, every time you share your faith or simply talk about Jesus, you are quoting or referring people to God's Word. The Apostle Paul asks, "How can they believe on Him in whom they never heard?" People cannot believe in Christ, if they have never heard of him or have a distorted image of him. That is why it is so important to get a copy of God's Word into their hands. Unfortunately, people usually will not believe the Gospel the first time they hear it. Most people will have to search the scriptures themselves and learn more about Jesus, and about the character and love of God, before they place their faith in Christ. And that is perfectly natural! Discipleship is a growth process that starts with sharing the gospel, witnessing of the love of God and Bible distribution.

As the facilitator of this course in your church or small group, are you ready to help train others in reaching the lost for Christ? Are you ready to encourage and inspire others to become a better and more mature witness for Christ? Wonderful!

10. Simple ways to share the Gospel:

- 1. Always remember the three A's of evangelism: Always Abide in Christ, Always be ready to an account of your hope in Christ with meekness and fear, and Always carry scripture with you at all times... Carry the Word, in your heart, and on your lips, and in your hand...
- 2. Witnessing from a Bible, or New Testament, or in conversation is easy to do...
 - 1. Remember these simple Biblical Truths when speaking to others:
 - 1. **GOD LOVES YOU -** "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (John 3:16)
 - 2. **ALL ARE SINNERS** "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23). As it is written, "None is righteous, no, not one. (Romans 3:10)

GOD'S REMEDY FOR SIN – For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 6:23. But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name. John 1:12.

For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received; that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the scriptures (1 Cor. 15:3-4).

ALL MAY BE SAVED NOW – Behold I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come into him, and dine with him, and he with me. (Rev. 3:20).

"For whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved." (Rom. 10:13)

- 4. **MY DECISION TO RECEIVE CHRIST AS MY SAVIOUR** Confessing to God that I am a sinner and believing that the Lord Jesus Christ died for my sins on the cross and was raised for my justification, I do now receive and confess Him as my personal savior.
- 5. ASSURANCE AS A BELIEVER That if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus Christ and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved (Rom. 10:9)

Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears my word and believes in Him who sent me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life (John 5:24).

These things I have written to you who believes in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life, and that you may continue to believe in the name of the Son of God (1 John 5:13).

But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name (John 20:31).

3. The Roman Road

Another good list of verses that are used to help share the gospel is known as the "Roman Road." One advantage to using these seven verses is that they are all found in the book of Romans, so you do not have to flip through that many pages of the Bible or New Testament. And you can link each verse together in a chain as you present some simple salvation facts with seekers.

Rom. 3:10: "As it is written, 'There is none righteous, not even one...'" **Rom. 3:23:** "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

Rom. 5:12: "Therefore, just as through one man sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, because all sinned."

Rom. 6:23: "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Rom. 5:8: "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us."

Rom. 10:9-10: "if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you shall be saved; for with the heart man believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation."

Rom. 10:13: "For whosoever will call upon the name of the Lord will be saved."

(Remember - put the Roman Road in your Bible. Go to Romans 3:10 and underline it and write Romans 3:23 next to it. Then go to the next verse and create a path to each of the seven verses.)

4. The Four Spiritual Laws

Here is another simple and effective way to sharing the gospel with someone. The well-known "Four Spiritual Laws" can be of help. They are simple, to the point, and use Scripture to convict, convince, and convert. These spiritual truths are like the verses written in the back of the Gideon Testaments:

- 1. **God loves you**: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:16).
- 2. Man is sinful and separated from God. "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" *(Rom. 3:23);* "For the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23); "But your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God" (Isaiah 59:2).
- 3. Jesus Christ is God's only provision for man's sin. "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but through Me" (John 14:6); "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:8).
- 4. We must individually receive Jesus as Savior and Lord. "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name" (John 1:12); "if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you shall be saved" (Rom. 10:9); "For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God" (Eph. 2:8).

Lesson 2: The Gospels' Effect on You.

The Gospel's effect on you: Our minds, our walk with God and our walk with others, our earthly state, our eternal state, our place in the body of Christ, our service to the body through God's Holy Spirit, who Christ is and who we are in Christ! We are being changed into the image of Christ daily.

One of the biggest differences in our lives, as a result of Christ living in us, is we are now living and feeding on the Word of God on a regular basis. The Bible has become our daily bread and our sustenance for spiritual growth in the presence of God. Christians need to be actively performing five essential disciplines to grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We need to be praying, studying Gods word, keeping His commandments, and be actively involved in a church fellowship and ministry to others.

In this section of our study, we will start off with some very thought provoking and challenging personal questions that are designed to help us "examine ourselves to see if we are in the faith" as stated in 2 Cor. 13:5 "Examine

yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves. Know ye not your own selves, how that Jesus Christ is in you, except ye be reprobates? Since these questions are of a personal nature and may require personal change in some areas of our lives, individuals can simply meditate on these questions in the quietness of their own heart and mind. These questions do not have to be spoken openly in a class setting.

1. Personal Ouestions to consider:

- 1. Are you in agreement with God when His word declares "All have sinned and fallen short of the Glory of God" (Romans 3:23)?
- 2. Do you agree with God's Word that declares the penalty of sin is loss of rewards for the believer and eternal damnation for the unbeliever?
- 3. Do you see your own personal need to be saved and have you confessed your sins to God and asked Him to forgive you of those sins?
- 4. Have you repented of those sins and all sins that stand in the way of your relationship with God?
- 5. Have you confessed with your mouth and believe in your heart that God raised Christ from the dead? (Romans 10:9,10)
- 6. Does the Holy Spirit reside in you as a result of your relationship with Christ?
- 7. Are you studying to show yourself approved, a worker who needed not be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth?
- 8. Are you praying, reading, participating in fellowship and serving the Lord where He leads you prepared to meet Christ at any moment?
- 9. Are you sharing the lifesaving gospel with those around you?

Lesson 3: Sharing the gospel with family and friends.

Sharing the Gospel of Christ with family and friends can be quite challenging, frustrating and yes rewarding... Reaching out to family and close friends is quite personal and can directly affect your relationships with those we love the most. These loved ones occupy the closest places in and around our heart. Their acceptance or rejection of the gospel can bring us great pain and joy.

If you have experienced great heartache in this area, you are not alone. But, be of good cheer and remember, every time you are led of God to share the word of God, it is having an effect in the lives of others. Even those who have hardened their hearts towards the gospel, are receiving good things from God: encouragement, correction, reproof... the gospel message. And eventually those seeds you are sowing may take root in a person's life...Sometimes immediately, but more often over a long period of time. The Holy Spirit is continuously encouraging the believer and reminding us that our labors are not in vain, that God's Word shall not return unto him void, "So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it". (Isiah 55:11)

We are to be patient like the farmer, who works the ground, sows the seed, waters the seed and nurtures the plant for God's glory. The Holy Spirit is constantly inviting us to be a part of this great harvest for the Lord and calls us to work alongside Him in this field.

Jesus said to his disciples, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men". When a fisherman goes fishing, he is not guaranteed to make a catch. But he goes anyway... When he goes, he goes in the strength of Hope. He hopes there will be a catch. In the same way, we go in the strength of hope that others will be saved. There is no guarantee that we will see someone come to Christ today, but we know that the word of God was shared, and that family and friends were encouraged to receive and follow Christ.

As you will see, there is Biblical proof that family and friends can come to Christ through sharing the Gospel. We will also see, that people can reject the gospel and become offended when they hear the gospel of Christ. If we realize this and accept these facts, then we will be in a much better position to handle these feelings when they do occur. We will also see that rejection is not necessarily permanent. Many people reject the gospel when they first hear it, for many reasons, but come to Christ later in life after they have worked through all their objections and possible misconceptions they had and carried around for years. We must remember it takes time, usually to open up to God. I would dare say that most people usually reject the gospel the first and second time they hear it... Now, let's look at the following scriptures references on reaching our family and friends with the gospel.

In addition, there are simple ways we can reach out to someone to say we are thinking about them or would like to honor them by donating a Bible or New Testaments in their name. Maybe in recognition of a special life event like a graduation or a birthday, or maybe when they are sick and need some encouragement, or at a passing of a loved one or a new birth. Some Biblical examples are: Joseph, Daniel, and Samuel...Don't shrink back when moral issues are discussed or in question at work.
 - 3. Don't shrink back when moral issues are discussed or in question at work.

- 4. Don't go to restaurants or places of business that are borderline or go beyond good moral character. Remember your company hired a Christian man or woman, which is much different that from a person who just happens to be a Christian on Sunday.
- 5. Be aware of the eternal condition of those you work with Do they profess Christ or not? Do they take the name of the Lord in vain? Are they involved in a cult? Are they open or closed to the gospel when you speak of spiritual matters?
- 6. Come along side your fellow workers to encourage them to follow Christ As you live sympathetically with others, develop a closer relationship with them, so that you may freely share your faith and offer prayers for them to help them through life.
- 7. Be equipped with scripture at all times Discipleship cannot happen apart from the Word of God. Keep either Bibles, New Testaments, gospels of John, tracts, etc... either at or in your desk or car. Be ready to give Bibles or other literature on special occasions to fellow employees as gifts. I.e., transfers, promotions, anniversaries, or when you or others leave the company for any reason.
- 8. How to handle opposition from others Love your peers and managers. Mat 5:44 But I say unto you, love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you... As much as is possible, live in peace with all men. In times of conflict, document your discussions with others. This makes for better communication should difficulties arise for you at work. Be pleasant, a good listener, a well-mannered individual. Conduct yourself in an intelligent fashion and avoid over reacting.
- 9. Ethics Strive to maintain and promote the highest standards of proper behavior. And when you are at fault, admit your mistake and take measures to regain the trust and respect of others.
- 10. Assume the role of a servant/leader The ambassador for Christ represents heaven on earth and will have to stand before Christ and give an account for his life and every idle word. People respect servant leaders.

4. What have you done or are doing to share the gospel at your workplace?

- How to overcome obstacles to sharing the gospel at the workplace. Most workplaces and companies 5. are very strict when it comes to doing anything other than what you are being paid to do; which makes sense... And stiff penalties can occur if we break those rules. So, the simplest way to share your faith is during lunch time. Invite your fellow colleague out to lunch and share the gospel on your own time, be prepared t give the other person scripture at that time as well, so that they can come to know Christ and grow into a disciple, give a bible or New Testament as a personal gift, when you or a fellow worker is leaving the company or on a special occasion. Also, you can start a lunch time ministry during your workday to the public and distribute scripture to others at a nearby public park. It's your lunch time and a lot can be accomplished a little each day when it comes to making yourself available to others and reaching out to them.
- Using your business to advance the gospel A simple and effective way to advance the gospel is to put up 6. a display rack in your business offering free scripture. Thousands of scripture cam be distributed if you have a lot of customers in one location or multiple locations.

Lesson 5: Sharing the Gospel with neighbors and community

The Bible has many scripture verses instructing us on how to live with our neighbors... The second great commandment is, "Love thy neighbor as thyself (Matthew 22:39). Sharing the gospel with our neighbors depends a lot on our relationship with our neighbors. If we have a close relationship, we can more easily share our own life experiences in light of scriptural truth. If you don't have a relationship with your neighbors, but one that is casual it may take more time to become friendly with them. If you have no relationship at all with your neighbors, then praying for relationship opportunities is of primary importance.

Ok, let's say you are quite content without having a relationship with your neighbors or your neighbors don't want a relationship with anyone, or may have serious issues they are battling. There are impersonal ways to still get the Word of God at least into their hands, until the time that a more personal relationship develops. For example: Mailing scripture to their homes as a gift from yourself or your church is one way, or you can do a door hanger outreach in your community as another way.

Admittedly, having a better relationship with our neighbors maybe the best approach, but each household and person is different when it comes to personal space and privacy; especially in America. However, getting the gospel into their hands, hearts and home is essential for salvation and it is what the Lord desires. As it says in 1 Peter 3:9 "The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is long suffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance."

7. Here are a few ways you can share the Word of God in your neighborhood:

1. Going door to door and giving away free Bibles from your church is an excellent way to ensure there is a Bible in every home around your church.

- 2. A door hanger outreach is an easy way to give away free scripture in your neighborhood.
- 3. Mailing scripture to the homes around your church is another way of spreading the gospel.
- 4. When neighbors move out or move into the community offer them a bible and some cookies or cake as a present for them.
- 5. Work with your church to serve the community in volunteering for community activities and bring gospels or Gideon Personal Worker Testaments with you to share with others.

Lesson 6: Witnessing to People of Other Faiths and Lifestyles.

The world is filled with different people, from different cultures, with different beliefs about God and lifestyles. We encounter them in our communities, at work, when we travel and sometimes, we meet new people when they knock on our front doors looking to share their religious or even political beliefs. How do we become better witnesses for Christ when we encounter people of other faiths, beliefs or lifestyles?

It usually starts with caring enough to learn, listen, and gain a better understanding from where people are coming from. It helps greatly to have a broader understanding of the different cultures and beliefs around us, so when we do encounter a person that holds different beliefs or lifestyles, we are better prepared to follow the admonition in 1 Peter 3:15 "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to *every man* that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear".

In a court of Law, there are several types of witnesses that are called upon to offer testimony. There is the Lay Eyewitness: one who has seen and experienced a certain event, and there is the Expert Witness that is called upon to provide superior knowledge than the average person usually on a particular topic. As a Christian we are called upon to bear witness to the wonderful work of God, through Christ in our lives. But our witness does not have to stop there. We can become expert witnesses to be used of God in a greater capacity and to better relate and communicate the gospel more effectively to others.

There are plenty of resources available to help us become familiar with other faiths such as: Mormons, Jewish, Islam, Jehovah Witnesses, Catholics, Hindus, Buddhists, and others. Having a good and thorough understanding of what the Bible teaches will enable us to distinguish the doctrines that are contrary to sound biblical doctrines. And that comes with study... As the Bible states, "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not be ashamed, but rightly dividing the word of truth (1 Time 2:15).

It would be beneficial to have a Sunday school class or seminar that teaches how to effectively reach others with the gospel on a regular basis. There are several good resources available that simply contrast other religions beliefs with Biblical teaching. One ministry that comes to mind is Freewordministries.org that helps provide, free scripture, free evangelism training material and information on effectively witnessing to people of other faiths.

Whatever ministry and resource you choose, becoming an Expert Witness for Christ enables you to a blessing to more and more people in your life...

Lesson 7: Ways of sharing the Gospel in your City or state.

Sharing the gospel in your city can be most rewarding. There are many different people to meet and many ways to share the gospel on a regular basis. The gospel can be distributed and shared in public parks, at street corners, bus stops, through local organizations such as missions, fairs and much more...

Reaching out to your city can start with a simple lunch time ministry of distributing the gospel and expand from there. You can place display racks in store fronts, work with other churches and ministries in spreading the gospel, you can form an evangelism team in your church, help equip your evangelism team members to go to local events, distribute scripture at community events, anything that the Lord places on your heart to do and where he leads you to go, can be a very exciting and rewarding time.

When you and your church join with others in sharing the gospel, not only are you affecting the lives of potentially thousands of people, but you are making friends with your fellow laborers and those friendship will last for an eternity...

Now reaching thousands and even millions of people in a city is simply a matter of having a vision, the resources, a formalized approach, and the desire to share the gospel on a much larger scale while working side by side with likeminded people. That is where Free Word Ministries and the Gideons excel... Form local county distributions to citywide outreaches that are called a Bible Blitz.

And publicly distributing it as well...

By doing a little each day, you can accomplish a lot over time, with God's help and God's people...
